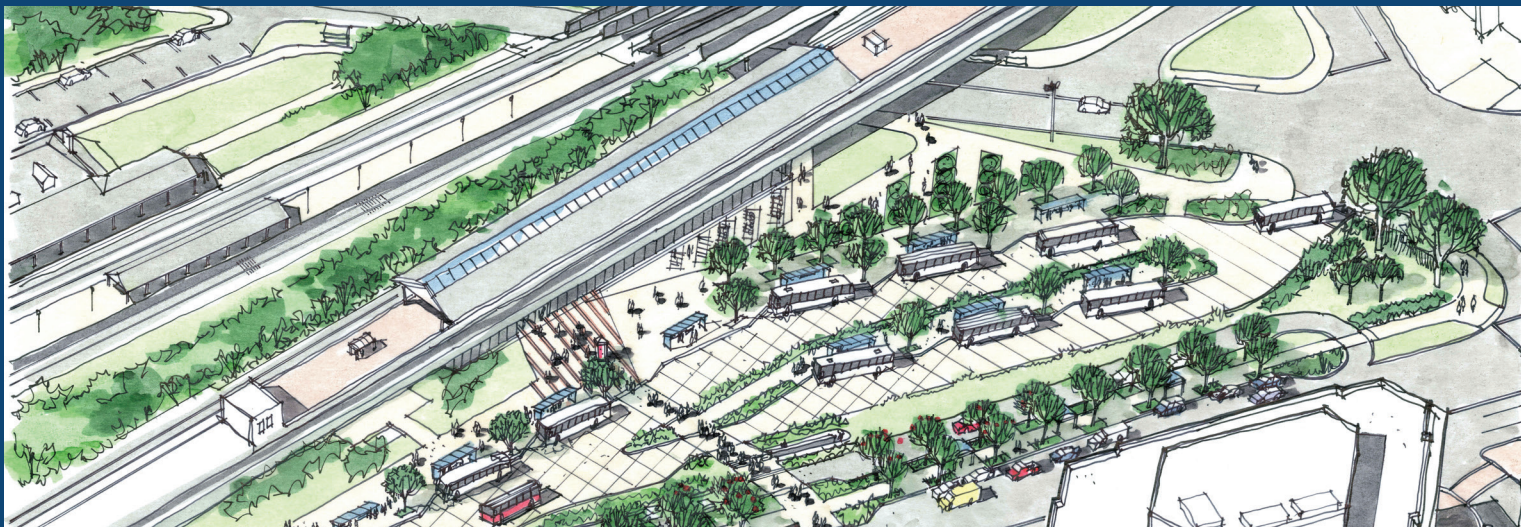


IMPROVING ACCESS TO THE KING STREET-OLD TOWN METRORAIL STATION

Giving pedestrians, cyclists, and transit users a safer, convenient, more attractive path to Metrorail



The King Street-Old Town Metrorail Station Access Improvement project will provide a safer, more attractive walking environment while maintaining efficient levels of service for buses and other transit vehicles accessing the site.

The project will:

- Improve pedestrian access and safety
- Add three bus bays
- Improve traffic flow
- Designate specific areas for bikes, shuttles, Kiss & Ride, taxis and carshare
- Improve landscaping, lighting and aesthetics

Major construction is scheduled to begin in **September 2018** and is expected to be completed by mid-2020.

The station will remain open with no impact to train service, but there will be significant changes *outside* the station.

During the first phase of construction: (approximately 17 months)

- Bus bays will be relocated to adjacent streets with pedestrian paths to access the temporary bus bays. (Starting Sept. 9)
- The Carlyle Pedestrian Tunnel will remain open. For your safety, please follow the signs and crosswalks.
- There will be no metered parking or shuttle bus access beginning August 6, and no Kiss & Ride area beginning Sept. 9. These services can be used at the Braddock Rd. or Eisenhower Ave. Metrorail stations.

Please plan for additional time getting to and from the King Street-Old Town Metrorail Station.

Drivers should be aware of increased congestion and limited on-street parking during project construction.
